






Tamba Seikatsuikan (Local Kimono Museum)

福知山市丹波生活衣館

Here traditional dyed and woven products such as kimono that were generally used in daily life from the late Edo period to around 1965 are collected and exhibited. The museum was opened in 2002 based on about 3,600 items such as locally produced Tamba cotton collected by Ms. Michiko Kawaguchi, a dyeing and weaving artist in Fukuchiyama City, and currently has 10,000 items in its collection. Of these, 2,076 are important materials for Fukuchiyama folk cultural properties. You can also experience weaving using a traditional Japanese weaving machine.

Fukuchiyama Castle

福知山城天守閣

A castle built by Japanese samurai warrior Akechi Mitsuhide, who settled this area in 1579. The main castle tower was destroyed in 1873 being reconstructed in 1889. The interior of the main tower is now a museum, displaying historical materials related to successive castle owners from Akechi Mitsuhide to curent day Fukuchiyama Castle.
